

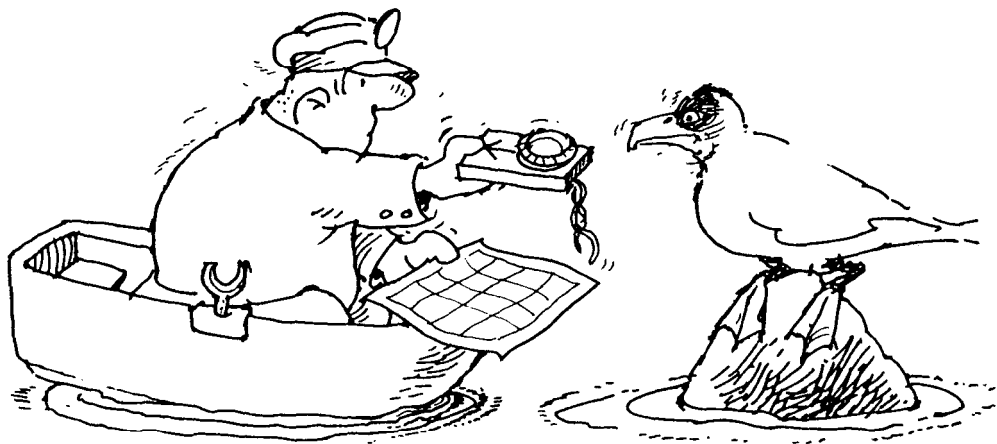

Time to look wider is NOW!

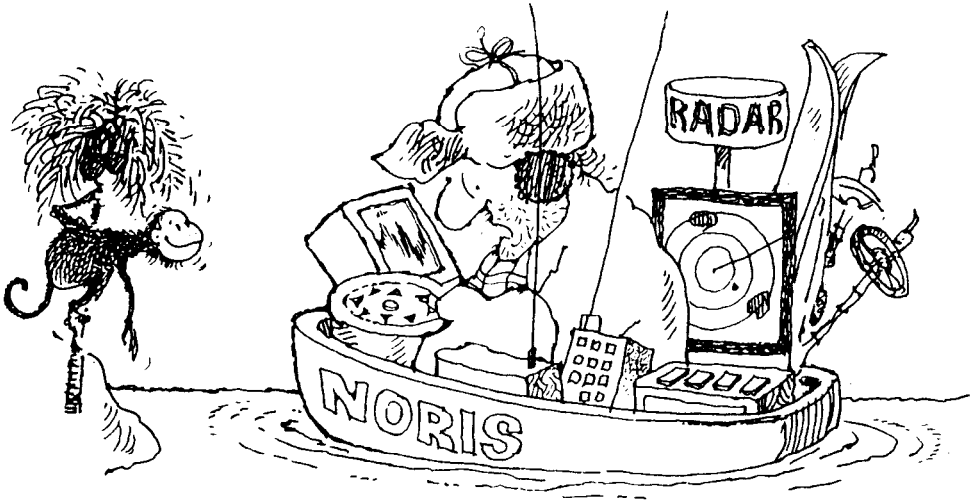

Although no deal is made, we hope that the seminar can take place on board the full-rigged ship "Christian Radic". The ship will sail from the South Atlantic during the spring, and will hopefully be back in Oslo in time for the seminar. We can only hope for pleasant winds and no delays!



To promote European sea-scouting generally, we hope it is possible to start planning for a scout activity like "Hands across the sea" or "Sea-scouts like the waves"

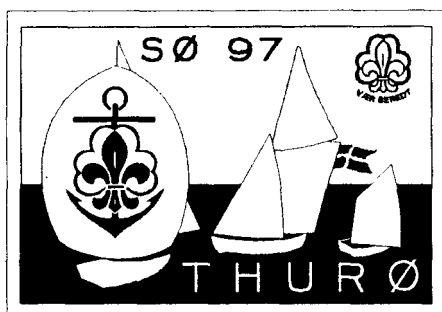

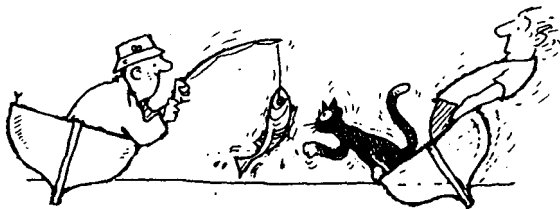
