Dates.

The 5th European sea scout/guide leaders seminar will be opened officially on Friday 23rd May at 0900 hrs, but we hope all participants are able to arrive in Oslo Airport Fornebu by Thursday 22nd May by 1700hrs.

The seminar will finish on Sunday, 25th May. The first possible departure by airplane will be at 1700hrs.

Oslo airport Fornebu has good connections to most European capitals. (many via Copenhagen, Denmark)



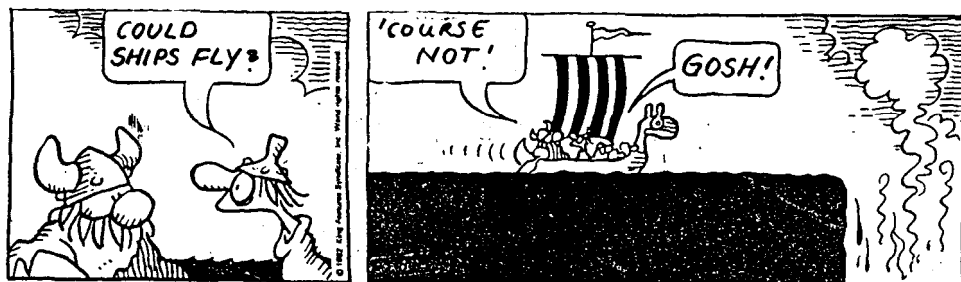
Location

The seminar will take place at the Y.M.C.A. camp-site at NÆRSNES, "Strandheim", less than 1 hrs coach drive from Oslo.

Hopefully, all participants will be able to sail from Oslo Airport Fornebu to the seminar

on board one of the sea-scout boats from the area.

We estimate 2 1/2 hrs sailing. All participants will be housed indoor, but a sleeping bag and sheet is necessary equipment.



COST

The cost per participant is NOK 2.000,- which includes all transport, accomodation and meals for the duration of the seminar and all activities undertaken. Payment is

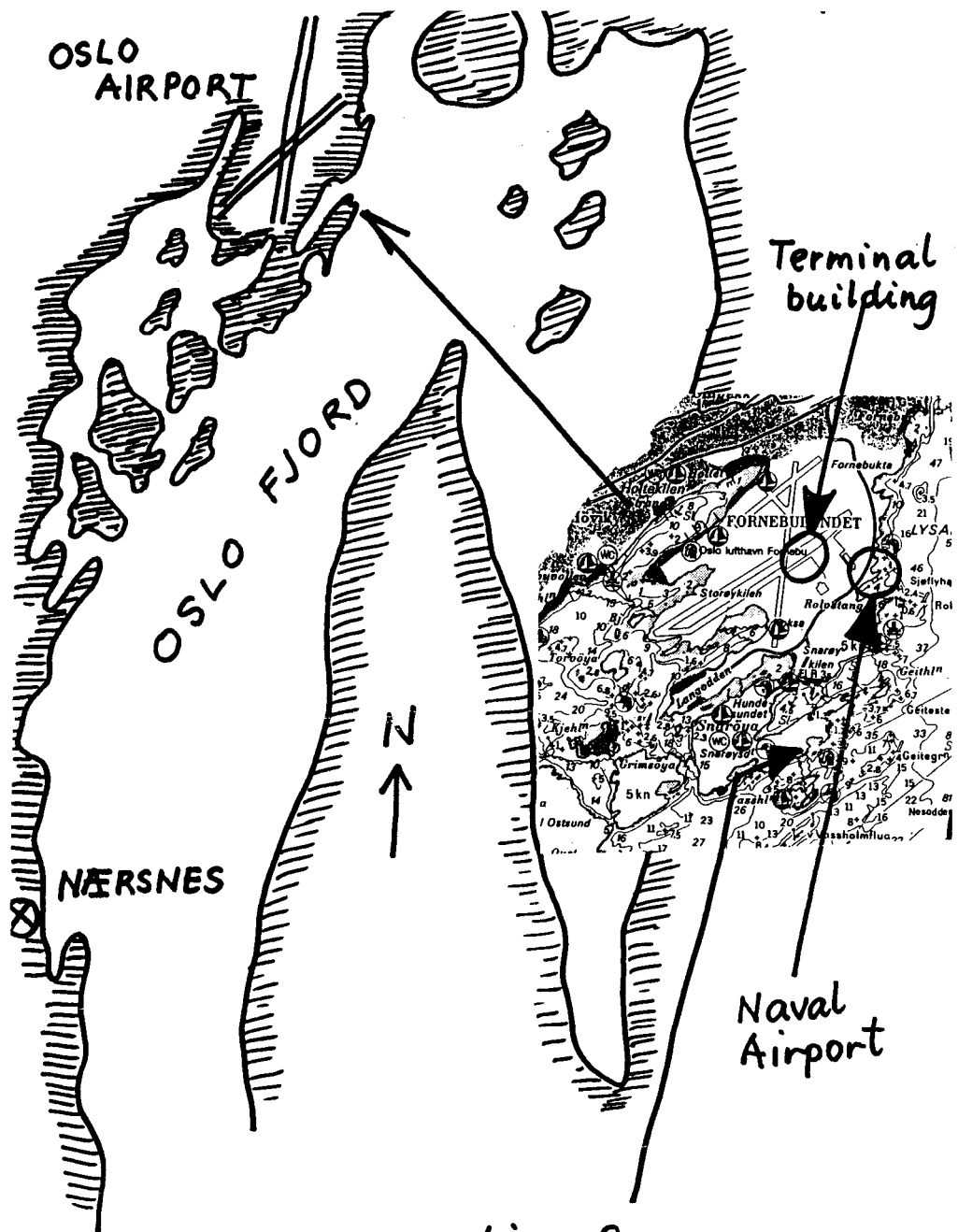
